

# Goyak Reservoir and Pump Station Site: Fencing Begins June 13, 2024

Greetings, Valued Customer,

Beginning on Thursday, June 13, 2024, Tualatin Valley Water District (TVWD) will begin the process to extend fencing to the real property line around the Goyak Reservoir and Pump Station site, located at SW 189th Avenue and SW Rigert Road. This will include asphalt removal to the southeast of the reservoir.

Fencing and asphalt removal is expected to take about two weeks. During this period, customers near the Goyak property may notice increased activity around the reservoir and pump station. We assure you that we will take all necessary measures to minimize any disruption to the surrounding community.

Fencing will help the site to remain secure and operational until later in 2025 when the reservoir and pump station are removed. In addition, there will be some asphalt removal and minimal vegetation removal within the property boundary to the south and southeast of the reservoir to allow for the fence installation.

#### What Customers Can Expect

- Working Hours: Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Impact on Services: There will be no interruption to water service during this fencing and asphalt removal work.
- Traffic Impacts: During work, crews will keep driveways on SW Rigert Road accessible.
- Disturbance: Fencing activities will generate noise, dust, and vibration to nearby properties.
- Large equipment: Front loaders, excavators, and dump trucks will be used during this
  project.
- Access: Fencing equipment and vehicles will access the reservoir and pump station site utilizing SW Rigert Road.
- Staging: Equipment, tools, and materials will be staged at the reservoir and pump station site.

• Safety Measures: All work will be conducted in compliance with safety regulations to ensure the wellbeing of our employees and the community.

## 189th Pump Station and Pipeline Project

The fencing and future removal of the Goyak Reservoir and Pump Station is part of the 189th Pump Station and Pipeline Project, currently underway in this area of the community. This project includes:

- Replacing both the existing 189th Pump Station and the Goyak Pump Station with a new pump station at the 189th location, and
- Installing new water transmission piping between the new 189th Pump Station and the Goyak Reservoir property.

Pump stations control the flow of water through the distribution system, and push water through pipelines from lower to higher elevations. The new 189th pump station and piping will push water from the valley floor to the Cooper Mountain Reservoirs located on Kemmer Road across from the Tualatin Hillsboro Park & Recreation District Cooper Mountain Nature Park.

The new water infrastructure will boost water service capacity by 60 percent, supporting the growing needs of the Cooper Mountain service area amid ongoing development and densification, well into the future.

The 189th Pump Station and Pipeline Project is a \$17 million investment in the water system. It will be funded by revenue from water rates, and \$3 million dollars in infrastructure funding by the Oregon Legislature as part of Senate Bill 1530, signed by Governor Kotek on April 17, 2024.
